



# 75TH ANNIVERSARY OF WARSAW UPRISING COMMEMORATIONS

The Warsaw Uprising broke out on August 1, 1944 and lasted 63 days. It was the biggest freedom surge against German forces in the history of World War II. Armed conflict spread to all districts of Warsaw. About 16,000 insurgents from the Home Army and 150,000 civilians were killed in the uprising. Today we pay tribute to the fallen insurgents and those who survived.
